On this day in:

1905

City Council members and citizens drafted a complaint condemning the action of Assemblyman J.H. Creighton and Sen. Clifford Coggina for the creation of two new offices in Shasta County. The two offices were to cost the

local taxpayers money, and the group was outraged it was not consulted before the bill was passed.

1955

Shasta County supervisors backed a recommendation from Albert Barr by voting to share the cost of three warning sirens for the Redding area. Barr said the federal government would pay half of the \$2,250 needed to pur-

chase the three city Fire Department sirens.

1980

Clella Schultheis of Ash Creek was arrested on charges of forgery as she walked out of Siskiyou County Superior Court after being acquitted of charges that she murdered her boyfriend. The warrant for her arrest came from Idaho, the Sheriff's Department said.

1995

The first challenge in Shasta County to a 5-year-old state law aimed at cracking down on drunken drivers was defeated, but the Redding attorney pushing the case vowed to appeal. Redding lawyer John Kucera argued that suspending the licenses of drunken-driving suspects was unconstitutional double jeopardy.
